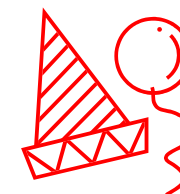

FOURTH ANNUAL JORDAN'S RIDE HOME POKER RUN

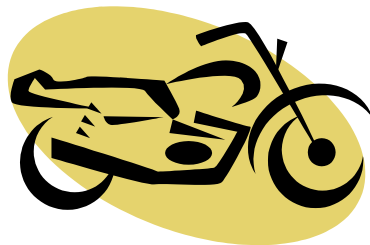
