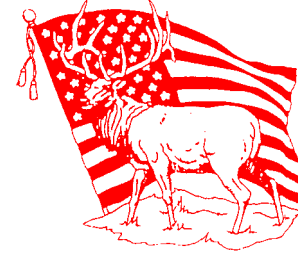

As always there are many Lodge functions coming up and they all need your help. You can buy a ticket or come down and help make the function work. This is part of our charitable work. Please help wherever you can.

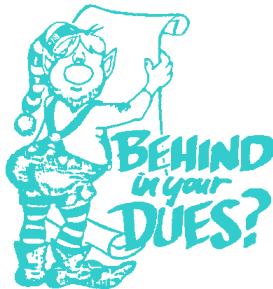
Balloting will take place at the **October 5** Lodge meeting and the new member initiation on **October 19**.

EXALTED RULER'S MESSAGE


